Music, family, mission, welcoming atmosphere, sermons, and the social aspect were some of the things that drew members to HPC.



Peace & Global Witness Offering This is one of four special offerings collected by the Presbyterian Church USA. A gift to the Peace & Global Witness Offering enables the church to promote the Peace of Christ by addressing systems of conflict and injustice across the world. Individual congregations are encouraged to utilize up to 25% of this Offering to connect with the global witness of Christ's peace. Mid councils (the Presbytery and Synod) retain an additional 25% for ministries of peace and reconciliation. The remaining 50% is used by the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of



violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness. One example of how the offering is used is the Global Peacemakers program through the PCUSA. Ten people have been named Global Peacemakers in 2023. Carmen Diaz (a colleague we have worked with in El Salvador) is among them. She is pictured with Joseph Rus a PCUSA mission coworker in El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras. Please support the Peace & Global Witness Offering this fall. It will be received on October 1st this year. The 25% of the offering will be used by our Matthew 25 committee to support a local Presbyterian African American Highland will be collecting this offering on **October 1st**.

Children during Sunday Morning Worship beginning September 10th

Ignite ~ **9:30 am** Children are invited to enter freely into the Ignite worship space on Sunday morning at 9:30 am from September ~ May.

Nursery during 10:00 am Worship Service Children ages 0 to 3 are invited to the nursery from 9:45 am until 10 minutes after the end of the service under the care of our SafeChurch volunteers.

Sunday School for Children during 10 am Worship Service Children ages 4 through 4th grade are invited to remain with their grown-ups in the sanctuary until they are dismissed for Sunday School during the service. SafeChurch volunteers will escort children to their classrooms for a Bible lesson, activity, and fellowship. (Children should be registered for Sunday School before going into the sanctuary). Activity bags are available in the classrooms to be picked up before and returned after the service for children who prefer to remain with their grown-ups during the entire service. All children should be picked up within 10 minutes after the end of the service.

Children in grades 5 and above are welcome to sit together during the worship service, remain with their grown-up, or assist in the children's classrooms during the service. Signs-ups are required.
