

Food Cupboard Donations - The challenges of food insecurity have increased substantially in our community with the decrease in food stamp allotments which occurred this Spring. The number of individuals requesting food assistance at the Lancaster County Food Hub has nearly doubled in the past twelve months. The Highland Food Cupboard has been supplying food for many years to the Food Hub and we are again asking your assistance either with cash donations or food items. The food items which are needed include peanut butter, breakfast cereal (low sugar), rice, pasta (whole wheat preferred), tuna/chicken(canned or pouches), and canned meals (individual servings w/pull tab cans). These items should not be past their expiration date and should be placed on the Food Cupboard shelves outside Fellowship Hall.



Upon Dottie's retirement, our concert series highlighting the new organ was renamed in her CONCERTS honor – and each season still includes an organ recital.

The DRS mission statement calls the series "a ministry of inspiration and nurture to our congregation and community at large." The series offers concerts throughout the year "featuring local, national and international musicians with the goal of offering the audience an opportunity to experience a variety of music." These concerts are provided free of charge and are supported only through free will offerings and patrons' annual donations. Through the series, many of our friends and neighbors are introduced to what Highland is all about. They also experience our fantastic worship space with its wonderful organ and Steinway concert grand piano not to mention the Highland Chancel Choir, which is always featured in the final concert of each season.
