All Saints Day



The early Christians marked the anniversary of a martyr's death as the day of "birth" into sainthood. By the middle of the first millennium there were so many martyrs that it became difficult to give them all their due. All Saints' Day was established as an opportunity to honor all the saints, known and unknown. In the Reformed Tradition things began to change. While we may give thanks for the lives of particular luminaries of ages past, the emphasis is on the ongoing sanctification of the whole people of God. Rather than putting saints on pedestals as holy people set apart in glory, we

give glory to God for the ordinary, holy lives of the believers in this and every age. It is a day set aside to give thanks to members of the community of faith who have died in the past year. We pray that we may also be counted among the faithful in God's eternal realm. On this Sunday the Memorial Garden Committee has provided white roses located in the narthex in honor of those who departed within this past year. We invite the families of those who died this year to stop at the round table and take a white rose in remembrance. As always, the Memorial Garden (accessed from a door located next to the library) is open to the congregation. You are most welcome to enjoy the peace and tranquility of this beautiful setting.

Thanksgiving offering during November. One program to receive \$35,000 from this fund raiser is Okra Abbey New Worshipping Community Solar Power for Resilience. Okra Abbey is a new worshipping community in the Pigeon Town neighborhood of New Orleans, a low-income area that is often overlooked as many neighbors struggle with housing and food insecurity, addiction and mental health issues. This unconventional community has a garden for a sanctuary and gathers around meal tables rather than pews. Utilizing the garden space and the ability to grow vegetables, Okra Abbey extends the welcome of Jesus to those who might otherwise not be interested or feel welcomed into a church. With the 2023 Thank Offering grant, Okra Abbey will become a solar powered space, resilient in the face of extreme storms and a hub for

disaster response. With reliable solar energy, they will reach out to neighbors daily by offering electrical outlets and a charging station. The vegetables grown at Okra Abbey are a starting point for conversation, and with the Thank Offering grant, Okra Abbey will be consistent hosts for community growth and faith discovery.
