Carl Sandburg, American poet and Pulitzer Prize winner, once said "nothing happens unless first a dream". This past Sunday, Highland Presbyterian Church members were dreaming, not during the sermon, but at the last congregational conversation! During the sermon, Pastor Allison encouraged and challenged us to use our own time, talent, and treasure to deepen our faith. Members were once again ushered to the Fellowship Hall after the service to participate in a lunch and conversation. They have been eagerly awaiting this conversation! Dreaming about the future is exciting, exhilarating, inspiring, and sometimes challenging.

Scott Billig first gave the participants a summary from the second conversation. This was a time of looking in the mirror at our church and looking out the window into our community. We gathered a few themes that Highland members are passionate about the present and the future. They are currently excited about chancel choir, youth and children's ministries, mental health missions, family ministry, and food hub missions, among many others! Some areas of focus for the future were found in mental health, missions, family ministry, chancel choir, food hub, youth at Highland, the assimilation team, and quite a few other areas.

Bill Owens led us as we participated in dreaming of Highland's future. He asked members to take a few minutes to close their eyes and focus on the year of 2030. What would we see, hear, and feel in 2030 at Highland? Luckily, we didn't hear any snoring during this time! Members took this exercise seriously and focused on some dreams for Highland: God-sized dreams. Dreams that are large enough to create new relationships, encourage new learning, challenge assumptions, and are spiritual in nature. There were sounds of chatter, laughter, and excitement found in the voices of participants, as everyone brainstormed some large God-sized dreams for the church. We focused on the areas of discipleship, fellowship, mission, worship, and witnessing. In small groups, members voiced their dreams into present-tense statements as they shared their dreams to other participants. There were many thought-provoking, compelling, and inspiring dreams.

Although it was our last conversation, the dreaming and action plan does not end here! The GPS team was, and continues to be, busy at work. We are gathering information from all three conversations, forming common themes, discussing the God-sized dreams, and presenting ideas to the Session.

Thank you for joining the conversations! We appreciate everyone's eagerness to participate and express your thoughts. We look forward to seeing what God has planned for Highland Presbyterian Church! However, we still need your help! The GPS team would like your prayers over the next few months as we enter a time of discernment and form a few Godsized dreams to grow Highland's discipleship, fellowship, mission, worship, and witnessing. There will be updates early next year with what is to come!
