"Gathering of Grieving Guys" Starting January 14th, Highland will be offering a time for grieving guys to gather together for six weeks to move through the significant stages of grief to arrive at a place of recovery in living their lives. Pastors Ann and Ken Osborne and other invited guests will lead you and other recently widowed and other grieving men through an engaging process involving brief information sharing, small group conversation, weekly reflection, journaling, and prayer support. The six weeks of connection will enable you to learn about how you personally experience grief and loss as well as offer you support for renewal, healing, and grief recovery. The weekly one hour gathering will be held from 11:30am to 12:30pm, in the prayer room, following the 10am Sunday, Worship Service. The study will start on Sunday, January 14th and finish on Sunday, February 18.th Each week will cover a different topic and use the resource entitled "The Grief Recovery Handbook" by John W. James and Russell Friedman. Copies of the \$10 resource are available for your purchase between now and January 14th when you register. You can register and purchase the book at the sign-up table in the Narthex on Sundays beginning December 17th.

Childcare During Christmas Eve Services Our **10:00 AM service** will have staffed nursery care for children ages three and under. All older children may grab an activity bag from the children's classroom area before service that day and remain with their grown-ups for the service. Families are also welcome to use the classroom space under the supervision of their own grown-up, since the service can be heard from the classroom's speakers. The **4:30 PM Family service** is meant for all ages! Everyone is invited into the Fellowship Hall; no childcare provided.

The **8:00 PM Traditional Candlelight Service** will not have any staffed childcare services available, but we will open the Chapel for families with children. We value the many types of learning styles of children and encourage families to utilize this family-friendly space when children need to move around. The service will be livestreamed in the Chapel so everyone can still be connected to the service.


