"The Gathering of Grieving Guys" provides a six-week grief recovery experience for men who are grieving a variety of different types of loss. Beginning after Worship from 11:30-12:30 each Sunday from Jan. 14 and through Sunday Feb. 18, men will meet in the Prayer Room (parallel to the Sanctuary in the small hallway next to the Sanctuary) to journey together for support, renewal, healing, and grief recovery discussions. Highland's new Parish Associate, Rev. Ken Osborne will facilitate this time together using "The Grief Recovery Handbook" by John W. James and Russell Friedman.
