



Sunday, March 17, 2024 Fifth Sunday in Lent

"If your brother or sister sins, go and point out their fault, just between the two of you. If they listen to you, you have won them over. But if they will not listen, take one or two others along, so that 'every matter may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.' If they still refuse to listen, tell it to the church; and if they refuse to listen even to the church, treat them as you would a pagan or a tax collector.

Friends, when you study Peter's story in scripture, you notice how much he loves asking questions. He asks Jesus: "What does the parable mean?" "Where are you going?" "How many times should we forgive?" Like a tenacious toddler, Peter was full of questions, because Peter was eager to learn. We may call this an example of "faith seeking understanding." So friends, let's be like Peter. Let's return to Christ with the humility of a student as we pray together the prayer of confession. Let this be a moment of learning. Let us pray:
