







Committee Corner ~ This week we highlight Presbyterian Women. Presbyterian Women (PW) nurtures women's faith though prayer and Bible study, supports the mission of the church in our local community and worldwide, and builds an inclusive, caring community of women that strengthen Highland Presbyterian Church and witnesses to the promise of God's kingdom. PW is part the national women's organization of the PCUSA. PW Coordinating Team oversees women's Bible study circles, holds a Christmas Tea for the women of Highland, collects toiletries for Christmas Gift Bags to Red Rose Manor, coordinates the Thank Offering in November and the Blankets of Hope in the Winter, and sponsors a Book Group. The Moderator of PW is Barb Droz, and the Staff Rep is Pastor Ann.
