



# Sunday, July 6, 2025 4th Sunday after Pentecost

Live creatively, friends. If someone falls into sin, forgivingly restore him, saving your critical comments for yourself. *You* might be needing forgiveness before the day's out. Stoop down and reach out to those who are oppressed. Share their burdens, and so complete Christ's law. If you think you are too good for that, you are badly deceived.

Make a careful exploration of who you are and the work you have been given, and then sink yourself into that. Don't be impressed with yourself. Don't compare yourself with others. Each of you must take responsibility for doing the creative best you can with your own life.

Be very sure now, you who have been trained to a self-sufficient maturity, that you enter into a generous common life with those who have trained you, sharing all the good things that you have and experience.

Don't be misled: No one makes a fool of God. What a person plants, he will harvest. The person who plants selfishness, ignoring the needs of others—ignoring God!—harvests a crop of weeds. All he'll have to show for his life is weeds! But the one who plants in response to God, letting God's Spirit do the growth work in him, harvests a crop of real life, eternal life.

So let's not allow ourselves to get fatigued doing good. At the right time we will harvest a good crop if we don't give up, or quit. Right now, therefore, every time we get the chance, let us work for the benefit of all, starting with the people closest to us in the community of faith.

#### How be encouraging as we connect with others.

- Give high regard, great respect and favorable thoughts to the people you trust as friends and colleagues and let them know it!
- Communicate more effectively by paying attention to how you say things. Start with praise.

  Never confront others. Describe how together, you can make things better. Highly respect every audience making sure to talk at the other person's level. Never speak in a parental or authoritarian voice to get your message heard.
- On every occasion, Be an encourager. Be specific in naming the gifts and graces the person possesses and how they touched you.
- When others make a mistake, be quick to forgive and forget; releasing them from guilt and shame that could take root in one's heart if not dealt with quickly.
- Be understanding. Ask intelligent questions to gain further insight. Accept what the speaker is sharing without judgement or condemnation. It is not necessary to answer at all -- decide to just be a listening ear.
- Keep others' secrets. Never speak stuff that causes unnecessary hurt to others by speaking unclaimed rumors behind their back.
- Share knowledge. Sharing helps us learn, discover, and understand things that are interesting. It has immediate application for our work, and life. It helps us grow and improves our daily conversations.
- Stay humble. A mature person is secure in their standing without needing to make noise, treating everyone with tremendous respect, regardless of position.
- Be positive! Positive thinking is explicit, definite and outspoken. It's contagious. Build up others with positivity, enabling them to be open for better things to come.
- Laugh and Love Use humor to defuse anger and conflict. Love and Care for others as you want to be cared for. The Golden Rule really does work!
