#### Hurricane Melissa Relief

Hurricane Melissa has devastated the Caribbean, becoming the strongest storm to hit the region in modern history. Communities are facing widespread destruction. ## **Supporting Neighbors Facing Food Insecurity**

With the ongoing government shutdown extending into November, many families are at risk of losing their SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits. About one in eight U.S. residents rely on this program to help put food on the table, and its disruption could leave millions struggling to afford groceries.

Highland is responding by collecting funds to purchase Giant grocery gift cards for our mission partner, the Transitional Living Center (TLC). TLC will distribute them to their clients and others in the community in need. This effort not only helps local families buy food but also generates additional income for Highland's ongoing hunger relief ministries.
