# **Committee Spotlight**

This week we highlight the Communion Guild. Every month, members of the Communion Guild gather at 9:00am on the Saturday before the first Sunday of the month to prepare the elements for Communion. They set-up and fill the bread and juice trays as well as ready the Communion table. The bread had been cut-up by a member of the guild earlier that week. Supplies are purchased regularly. Currently, our faithful and congenial workers are Susan Basore, Diane Ingram, Rachel Reist, and Sara Shank led by Linda Ginn and Lee Heisey (the chairs). The committee works under the Worship and Music Council.

**From Your Stewardship Committee -- Pay it Forward!** There are a number of ways you can "pay it forward' by creating a legacy for Highland Presbyterian Church. All the options below have the advantages of not reducing your current financial situation or income (perhaps even enhancing it) while in many cases allowing you to escape federal and state taxation.

**Bequests** are the easiest way to "pay it forward." Including a bequest in your will to Highland Presbyterian can take several forms.

- Cash Is easy to designate but runs the risk of reduced value due to inflation.
- Percentage of assets avoids the problem of the amount being eroded by inflation.
- Real Estate can provide a unique opportunity. The donor may transfer a home or other property.
- If it is a personal residence or farm, the donor can retain use of it during their lifetime.

**Retirement Plans** such as IRAs, 401(k)s and 403(b)s can be used to designate a charitable beneficiary upon your death, usually for a percentage of the account's balance. Typically, all one needs to do is revise the plan's beneficiary designations, and there is no need to change your will or other estate plan documents.

**Life insurance** with Highland as the beneficiary ensures that a fixed sum goes to Highland upon your passing. Often this is an "old" policy whose cash value has risen over the years.

Appreciated assets, such as stocks or other securities, can be transferred to Highland. Many stocks and other securities have a value far in excess of the original cost which, if converted during your lifetime, lead to capital gain taxation. Transferring these to Highland during your lifetime avoids that tax. Charitable remainder trusts allow a future gift to Highland while receiving income during your lifetime.

A trustee makes payments from the trust to the income recipient during their lifetime. When the income payments end the remaining assets would become available for the work of Highland.

**Annuities** take a variety of forms and should be individually tailored for your situation. All of them have tax advantages, but their main benefit is to guarantee lifetime income for the owner. Annuities may be for a single life or for two. Remaining funds (if any) could be transferred to Highland as a beneficiary.

## **MISSION & OUTREACH CORNER**

**Arch Street Volunteer Opportunities** ~ **Picnic Lunch on July 19:** Highland's Local Outreach Committee will be sponsoring a cookout at the Arch Street Center on Friday, July 19. Many of our regular volunteers have signed up to help prepare side dishes, bake cookies or flip burgers and serve food at the event. We could still use a few more volunteers to prepare side dishes/salads for the lunch.

Ongoing Monthly Lunches: This is an easy way to help our friends at Arch Street. Each month we need



about 10 volunteers to prepare casseroles or bake cookies so we can provide a hot meal for about 60 members of Arch Street Center. The recipe is provided. Highland volunteers then purchase the ingredients and prepare the food at home and deliver it to the church at a designated time. The next morning all the food is delivered to Arch Street to be heated and served for lunch. Currently there is a faithful core group of about 15 volunteers. They are notified of the schedule ahead of time and sign up as they are able. There is no expectation for a volunteer to participate every month. The more volunteers we have, the

more we can "share the load." If you would like to be on the list and receive the emails specifying the menus and dates, please sign up. There is no obligation. Some volunteers prefer making casseroles, some like to bake, and some do both. Whatever your level of participation is, your efforts will be appreciated. **Update from GPS (God's Plan Seekers) team** ~ Have you been wondering what is going on behind the scenes with the GPS team? Summer vacation may be starting, but we haven't set this important task aside! The GPS team has been extremely busy since the last update in March. It has almost been a year since we started the journey of our visioning process and congregational conversations. The GPS team has come far; it has been quite the journey of discernment, growth, discovery, and collaboration.

At the end of March, Pastor Allison announced the new vision statement, "At HPC, we are seen, known, and loved by God through Jesus Christ and we Partner with the Holy Spirit to see, know, and love God, all God's people, and the world God created." This vision allows us to reflect and act on God's love and compassion for ourselves, our neighbors, the Earth, and everything He has created. It aligns with the GPS team's visioning process and provides a foundation for future goals, decisions, and plans for HPC.



The GPS team has designated three focus areas: mission, worship, and discipleship. These are three of Highland's strengths that were uncovered from the Fall 2023 conversations. As we've been reflecting on the congregation's input, the team has noticed all of these areas are intertwined and connected. Without one, we cannot be successful with the others. It is important to keep this in mind as we continue going through this process.

The GPS subcommittees have formed near-term (Sept. 2024 to June 2025), mid-term (July 2025 to June 2027), and long-term (July 2027 to June 2029) objectives with specific key results for each category. We are excited to give the congregation more details on the objectives and key results in the Fall!
