

Highland Presbyterian Church is an Earth Care Congregation of the PC(USA). Being an Earth Care Congregation means that we recognize the restoration of creation as a central concern which we incorporate into the life of the church. We reflect this in the second part of our vision statement: "We strive to see, know, and love God, all God's people, and the world God created."

In the very first chapter of Genesis, after creating the world in which we live and humans as part of that world, God charges humanity to have "dominion" over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and every living thing that moves on the earth. In this command we are charged to be responsible for the miracle that is this planet of perfect balance. As part of this creation, made from the very dust of the earth, we are responsible for the well-being



of this world.

As an Earth Care Congregation, we commit to caring for the earth in four categories: worship, education, facilities, and outreach. We pledge to celebrate in worship God's grace and glory in creation, and we declare that God calls us to cherish, protect, and restore the earth. We pledge to educate ourselves about threats to God's creation and to seek ways of keeping and healing the world. We pledge that we will manage, maintain, and upgrade our facilities in a way that respects and cherishes all creation. We pledge to encourage community involvement that protects and restores our neighborhood, region, nation, and world.

One of the primary ways that we fulfill our pledges is through the work of our Earth Care Committee. These folks meet regularly to discuss our areas of commitment and to explore how to provide congregational opportunities for congregation members through partner agencies like Interfaith Partners for the Chesapeake, and the Lancaster County Conservancy. The committee is currently working on implementing the congregation's Green Master Plan to improve our outdoor space. How can you as a congregant participate in our Earth Care Congregation Pledge? You can participate by recycling with our Terracycle Center. Did you know that 1 billion toothbrushes are thrown out in the U.S. every year? That's 50 million pounds of garbage! At Highland Presbyterian Church we have three bins that are labeled with items that we recycle in the office and in the Narthex by the Fellowship Hall doors. We are not only collecting here at Highland, but we are actually a drop site for the community.

What do we collect? We collect toothbrushes, empty toothpaste tubes, and empty packaging. We collect Arm&Hammer and Oxiclean pouches (all brands), and air and home care trigger heads and bottles. Other recycling programs will be added in the future so stay tuned.

What happens to the recycled goods once they reach the R&D Recycling Operations Department? In-house scientists and material application specialists analyze the materials to determine the right way to process them into something new. Then the forming begins. For example, metals and aluminum are shredded and smelted into metal sheeting, ingots, or bar stock. Glass is crushed and melted to be used in new glass bottles (if clear), or brick, cement, or concrete applications (if colored). Rubber is generally cryo-milled into a powdered state for flooring applications. Organics are composted or used in industrial and commercial fertilizers. Plastics are the largest category of materials collected, they are size reduced (made smaller by being shredded or ground), then melted and reformatted into pellets, flakes, or a powder format. After they recycle the waste into raw material, it's sold to manufacturing companies who produce the end product and complete the recycling journey.

What are examples of the recycled goods once they go through the shredding and smelting process? The end products may include outdoor furniture and decking, plastic shipping pallets, watering cans, storage containers and bins, tubes for construction applications, flooring tiles, playground surface covers, athletic fields, and more!


