Names for a one-year term on the Nominating Committee will also be selected. The completed slate will be presented at the next Congregational meeting.

Session (Elders) are the leadership body of HPC, called to lead, govern, discern and discipline.

Trustees are the leadership body of the corporate entity of HPC: stewards of church finances & managers of facility operations, maintenance, and security.




ADVENT AT HIGHLAND

During the month of September we will support them by collecting jars of peanut butter.


Please bring your donations to the designated table in the Narthex. Let's see if we can collect 200 jars of peanut butter!
