Highland Afghan Resettlement Initiative:

Update on Afghan Family

In 2021, Highland sponsored several families and individuals who fled Afghanistan when it fell to the Taliban. One of the refugees we assisted was a young woman who resettled in Lancaster with her extended family. Sahar worked two jobs (including one at Church World Service) while attending HACC, where she graduated last year with honors! This summer she was accepted into Cornell University's Architecture program. We wrote a letter of support explaining why her parents (who escaped to Pakistan) are unable to provide financial assistance. Sahar was awarded an academic scholarship and received a dependency override. She began the program this fall and is grateful to be making new friends while diligently studying and working on design projects.



Meanwhile, Sahar's parents and four siblings are in a somewhat safe, but often precarious living situation. Last year, they applied for refugee status through Welcome Corps. Highland raised the necessary funds for their travel and initial support. We anticipated their arrival this past January when all refugee admissions were suddenly halted. We invite you to join us in praying that an exception will be made so the family can travel here as refugees and be reunited with Sahar.

Treasures in Our Midst

Highland is proud to serve as the custodian of the many beautiful works of art and historic artifacts that are displayed throughout the church. These treasures, both historical and contemporary, enrich our shared space and help to tell the story of our faith community. The **Art and Artifacts Committee** is dedicated to making the congregation more aware of these remarkable pieces, as we believe they are a meaningful part of our collective heritage.

This beautiful walnut Celtic cross was carved by Highland member Barry Wood. He incorporated the Celtic knot and rings to symbolize eternity, God's never-ending presence, and God's love for his people. The intricate interlacing of the Celtic knot, with no beginning or end, visually represents eternity and the unbroken connection between God and His people. The cross is on display in the narthex on the wall to the right of the nursery.

The Art and Artifacts Committee has also created a self-guided Holy Spirit Doves and Celtic Crosses Tour which allows you to explore these meaningful works at your own pace.
