

## **From Your Stewardship Committee:**

### Thank You and a Reminder

Highland's congregation has responded generously to this fall's stewardship campaign. As of December 8, about 248 individuals and families have pledged just over \$975,000 in financial support for 2026. This will go far in helping us meet what is expected to be a 2026 budget of around \$1.4 million, and we are grateful for the response so far.

At the same time, some 66 individuals and families who submitted a pledge for 2025 have not yet done so for 2026. To get us further toward greater support of next year's budget, we need to hear from those who have not yet pledged. Pledge cards can be obtained by calling the church office. It is not too late to pledge, and no amount is too small.

### **Winter Weather Closure Policy**

Highland Presbyterian Church will continue to monitor Manheim Township School

District (MTSD), but weather decisions will be made based on actual conditions and safety, not strictly school status. If Manheim Township School District issues a delay, or if Highland determines road/parking conditions warrant a delay, Highland will operate on a 2-hour delay.

#### **Full Closure**

A full closure happens when roads, parking, or walkways are unsafe. During a full closure, the office and all in-person programs are canceled, with essential staff allowed on-site (if safe to do so). Announcements will be made via the church website, email, social media, WGAL, and phone message. Outside groups will be notified directly.

## **Highland Happenings**

### **Ingathering Sunday & Giving Tree Mission**

On November 30, several hundred gifts filled the narthex as a result of our annual Giving Tree mission. This year, Highland donated **345 in-kind gifts** and **142 gift cards** — nearly 500 gifts in total! Through your generosity, we were able to provide gifts to individuals supported by **13 local agencies**, help support the Healthy Beginnings program, and donate Bibles to the Lancaster County Prison.

More than 40 Highland members took part in this year's effort, supported by a core committee who creates and hangs the tags on the trees, shops, collects and organizes the gifts on Ingathering Sunday, and delivers them to our partner agencies. We are grateful for every person who contributed — whether you purchased a gift, volunteered your time, or prayed for the project's success. Thank you for helping make this wonderful, caring mission possible.
